
# First Eagle Global Fund

Standard Deviation is a statistical measure of the distance a quantity is likely to be from its average value. It is applied to the annual rate of return to measure volatility. Active share measures the percentage of a fund's portfolio holdings differing from its benchmark. Active share can range from 0% (index fund) to 100% (no commonality with the benchmark index)

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MSCI World Index (Net) measures the performance of large and midcap securities across 23 developed markets countries. The index provides total returns in US dollars with net dividends reinvested. A net return index tracks price changes and reinvestment of distribution income net of withholding taxes. MSCI EAFE Index (Net) measures the performance of large and midcap securities across 21 developed markets countries around the world excluding the US and Canada. A net return index tracks price changes and reinvestment of distribution income net of withholding taxes. Str 500 Index (Gross/Total) is a widely recognized unmanaged index including a representative sample of 500 leading companies in leading sectors of the US economy. Although the S&P 500 Index focuses on the large cap segment of the market, with approximately 80% coverage of US equities, it is also considered a proxy for the total market. The S&P 500 Index includes dividends reinvested. A Total Return Index tracks price changes and reinvestment of distribution income.
